Positions on the June 2006 Ballot Measures (as adopted by the Board of Directors)

Proposition	Description	Position	Comments
A	<p>Homicide Prevention Planning Council Prop A is a Charter amendment that would budget an additional \$10 million primarily from the General Fund for each of the next three fiscal years to fund violence prevention and intervention services to high risk populations. It also establishes a Homicide Prevention Planning Council and a Survivors' Advocate in the Office of the District Attorney with a survivors fund to assist survivors of homicide victims.</p>	Neutral	<p>The League supports social and economic justice and the health and safety of all Americans. Violence prevention and intervention services are important parts of our social policy positions. On the other hand, the League cautions against the earmarking of funds from the general treasury fund. Because of these two positions, we are taking a neutral stance.</p>
B	<p>Disclosure of the Eviction of Elderly or Disabled Tenants Prop B is an ordinance that would add a requirement that landlords who offer to sell buildings of two or more residential units disclose in writing to all potential buyers the specific legal grounds for evictions and whether evicted tenants are elderly or disabled.</p>	No position	<p>The League does not hold any relevant positions related to this proposition.</p>
C	<p>Appointing Board Members to the Transbay Joint Powers Authority Prop C would change the City's appointments to the Transbay Joint Powers Authority by designating the Mayor and two members of the Board of Supervisors to represent the City.</p>	Oppose	<p>The League holds the position that appointees to boards and commissions should have the commitment and time to serve, have the proven ability in a field related to the board, and have objectivity in working on the relevant board or commission. The League also supports measures to increase, not decrease, the responsiveness and effectiveness of the members of the Board of Supervisors. Prop C would require the already busy mayor and two members of the Board, rather than appointed individuals, to serve on the Transbay Joint Powers Authority.</p>
D	<p>Laguna Honda Hospital, Zoning for Health Care Facilities Prop D would amend the Planning Code to create a special use district that includes Laguna Honda Hospital, allow both publicly and privately-owned residential health care facilities in "public" districts, and limit those who can receive services at certain residential health care facilities in these districts.</p>	No position	<p>The League does not hold any relevant positions related to this proposition.</p>
